

The President's Perspective



Dear Glenburn Members,

Thank you for the loyal and continuing support Glenburn Tennis Club has received from members over the last twelve months. It's been amazing to work together through the issues thrown at us and lovely to see the club pull through in great shape. You might think the club hasn't changed much, but many exciting things have happened. Glenburn now has **the largest ever cohort of juniors** coming through and **the most ever number of teams** in the WDTA.

As the club approaches its 40th anniversary, I assure you membership fees are being allocated toward important upgrades. Additionally, the committee is taking the lead to ensure Monash Council are aware of our needs as a community and are ready to help us any way they can. We expect more good things for the club in the next year.

With the help of Sergius Erwin and Dharmesh Rowjee, Glenburn has an excellent new website: www.glenburntc.com. This is a huge upgrade and sincere thanks to all who helped deliver the project. It would cost a fortune without the knowledge and application of volunteers who do all this work for free! This is the community spirit we need to maintain long into the future.

Special thanks to everyone who helps with maintenance and attends working bees. The committee has adjusted works requirements by engaging a new contractor for lawns and recently reviewed some minor works. The building is showing its age and we'll continue to look for ways to improve amenity. The priority is a new kitchen and to install air conditioning. The committee welcomes feedback and ideas from members so come and join the committee if you want!

In the last eighteen months, Glenburn struggled to get precise information from Council as they developed a new policy for tennis clubs. With urgent issues like tree roots affecting our playing surface, it was disappointing we didn't get the clarity to make informed decisions. Recently though, it was revealed Monash Council had won a bid to relocate the Bulleen Tennis Centre to Jells Park, and this had affected communication with local clubs. We've since discovered Glenburn is in great shape comparatively and can plan ahead with certainty, longevity and their full support. Council will make good on the tree roots, and we're planning re-surfacing of impacted courts with council help as our finances and their budgeting process allows. In the meantime, we're patching Court 2 to fix the seam split.

We have a **new card entry system** which includes additional security features. It took time but the system is working well. It makes a huge difference to the way court access is managed and is vital to ensure sustainability of our club. A huge thanks to Sharon Wan and Glenys Zambelli who work tirelessly to keep membership running smoothly. Both were pivotal in the change management process and they had allocated lots of time to distribute cards and deal with communications. This important shift in membership access streamlines ongoing administration.

A local tennis club is nothing without its members, but we also need support from all levels of government. Glenburn has developed good relations with local and state offices and recently the federal member, Gladys Liu, came for a visit to check our new lights. With assistance from Charles Rossiter, Glenburn was able to access a federal grant to assist with the cost of **lighting upgrades to courts 1,2,3, and 4**. The result is a big improvement in light levels including a reduction in energy use and maintenance costs. The LED lights will last the club at least 30 years and have tripled brightness on the courts. The committee continues to apply for grants and will look to upgrade the lights on courts 5 and 6 at the next available opportunity. In the meantime, the committee replaced the bulbs to ensure courts 5 & 6 are at optimum performance for night-time play.

Another great news is our club is becoming more diverse, membership has rebounded strongly and there is still much more we can do.

Don't forget you can join social groups every Monday (Mens) and Thursday (Mixed) mornings. Stick around for lunch in the clubhouse! If you see **Geoff Cook** – congratulate him on the **Community Award** he received from Gladys Liu for the effort he's put into Glenburn over many, many years. I'd like to thank all past and current members of the committee for joining in and getting things done. Special mention to Rob MacDougall for his dedication to the club (which has saved us a fortune in electrical works) and Peter Hudson who demonstrates the care and attention to detail all committees need to be effective.

Finally, don't be a stranger! Now we've made it through the pandemic – let's make a resolution to build the club's community spirit. Reach out anytime and let me know you're interested in getting to know the club better!

Grants Update

- The club received 2 grants each of \$1000 last year to cover for Covid expenses.
- We were unfortunately unsuccessful with our submission for shade clothes grant.

Should anyone know any possible grant prospects, please let the committee know.

You may be aware of a number of the actions taken by your volunteer management committee over the last period, but I include a list of them here for the record.

Regular committee meetings have been held (both via Zoom during the lockdown and now face to face) to continue our agenda of planned improvements and actions. These include:

[1] Planning for, implementation and rollout of the **new card entry system** to replace key access. If you still have not picked up your card, following membership renewal, please refer to the information in the last page of this newsletter.

[2] Our aim is to comply with all regulations including those relating to working with children. Be assured that all committee members have current **Working with Children Check's in place**.

[3] Many of you will be aware of the project to **replace the lights on courts 1-4 with LED lights**. This is now completed. It involved applying grants for 2 courts (thanks to Charles Rossiter) and the club funds for the other 2 courts, specifying and ordering the components and finally fitting them. Lots of effort by several committee members including our new President, Andy Moore, as well as our club electrician Rob McDougal.

[4] Recently the **globes on courts 5 and 6 have been replaced**. The lux levels (light intensity) on all 6 courts will now be much improved. For those using courts 5 and 6 during the day, remember that if you have invited a visitor that the visitor fee must be paid before play. The box is near the north facing door by the Kitchen. Courts 5 and 6 can also be used at night by paying for use of the lights, except when needed for Night Tennis competition.

[5] Our gardener continues her good work and **the committee has appointed a new person to mow the lawns**, Together, these people will keep the grounds in great shape. Please respect the work they do, mind where you step and keep the grounds and clubhouse clean and tidy.

Good afternoon all,

After being put on hold in 2020, we are excited to announce the **Future Leaders Program is back in 2021, bigger and better than ever**. The Program will take place from Monday 20th September through to Wednesday 22nd September at PGL Campaspe Downs in Kyneton.

The Future Leader's Program is designed for **Year 10 and 11 students** and provides participants with the opportunity to make a difference at their local tennis club!! This year, Tennis Victoria also invites **Year 12 students** to apply if they feel they can also manage any study commitments they have.

Program participants attend a three day camp, develop important teamwork and leadership skills and work with Tennis Victoria to develop a project plan to take back to their tennis club to complete. Participants are then required to complete a minimum of 40 hours work in completing the project. On top of this, participants will also attend pre and post camp sessions online to further develop their leadership skills and work with Tennis Victoria to fine tune their projects. Courts are available for members' use anytime outside the designated times.

Lighting is available on court 5 & 6 for a small charge.

Bylaws Section D Item 4 - Court Usage

- 4.1 Courts in use for competition and Club tournament matches will not be available for use by other members
- 4.2 No court shall be monopolised by two (2) players when doubles matches are possible and desired by members present at the time.
- 4.3 Four (4) players shall not occupy a court for more than a maximum of thirty (30) minutes while other members are waiting to play except during competition or tournament play.
- 4.4 Doubles play shall take precedence over singles in any situation in which members are waiting to play and no other court is available.



GTC Membership 2021/2022

- Access card to the courts
- Playing junior & senior competitions
- Voting rights

Membership for 2021/2022 is due and payable by **30th June 2021**.

New and renewing members need to go to **our club website** and look under the Membership section for a link to the **Online Membership Portal**.

Unfinancial members will not be able to use the court access cards after 30th June 2021. For insurance purpose, the club will need to withdraw any unfinancial junior and senior players from competitions.

Membership Q&A

- Q:** Why do we need to enrol our kids as junior members to play competitions?
A: This is Tennis Victoria regulation as the fee covers their insurance while playing tennis. Please also note that club membership is separated from tennis coaching fees.
- Q:** Why can't we create multiple online accounts with one email address?
A: The account is with Tennis Australia. Our club cannot change how the membership system works. One email address can only be used for one account.
- Q:** When will I get the court access card?
A: All members will be notified via email for the card distribution time. Please understand that our club is run by volunteers and the committee members are not working full time for the club.
